Crossroads Pro-Life Walks Across America: An integral part of Crossroads are their yearly pro-life pilgrimages across the United States. Each summer, young adults walk on three simultaneous pro-life walks across America from Seattle, San Francisco, and Los Angeles to Washington, D.C.. Walking almost 10,000 miles and through 36 states, these young people hope to convert the hearts and minds of others – at the grass-roots level – by witnessing to the dignity and sanctity of all human life, from the moment of conception to natural death. Sydney Dunavin, our speaker today, is requesting donations to be made out to Crossroads. She will be available after both Masses to discuss this Mission.

Fr. William Writes: “*Handing on the Faith*” to the next generation is one of the most important tasks in any Catholic community, our Parish included. Mrs. Kay Bulzacchelli and Mr. Freddie Quiteno are our Directors of Religious Education, Kay for the younger children and Freddie for the Confirmation and High School students. Other folks assist them as classroom teachers. We have been taking on “*Catechesis of the Good Shepherd*” for the younger children. The program comes in 3 stages: (I) 3-4/5 year olds, i.e. Pre-School to Kindergarten; (II) 5/6-8/9 year olds, i.e. Grades 1-3; (III) 8/9-11/12 year olds, Grades 4-6. We have yet to implement stage III of the Good Shepherd Program. In the older group are the Confirmation students and the High Schoolers who are already Confirmed. **We need teachers for next school year!** Training is available and resources for it are provided by the Parish. If you think you might be able to manage a class of younger children please contact Kay Bulzacchelli. (If you think you might be able to manage a class of High Schoolers, please contact Freddy Quiteno. Help is REALLY needed for this apostolate in our Parish. (see Directory opposite for contact)

Catechism Study Group continues in Father Bernard Hall this Wednesday evening after Mass, due to Summit Nashville.

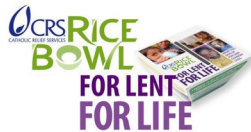
