Fr. William Writes: On Tuesday 21st August, I attended a one day in-service seminar at the Catholic Pastoral Center organized by the Diocese and the National Chaplain Center of the Department of Veterans Affairs. The theme of the day was **Helping Veterans Heal**. We aren't always aware of struggling Veterans in our community or how we might help a Veteran and his or her family following deployment. There can be many struggles in the return to civilian life but not great knowledge abroad as to how to be of assistance. The in-service day was a helpful move in the right direction for our priests, deacons, and others working in parish ministries.

On Tuesday this week, **the Church keeps the memory of St. Augustine**, Bishop of Hippo in Roman North Africa (354-430). Augustine was the son of a pagan father and a Catholic mother. He was a brilliant philosopher but he struggled with morality as a young man. Always enjoying friendship and fraternity, even before his conversion, he lived a communal life with other young people, and upon his conversion, continued to live life in community, On being chosen as a Bishop, he continued with his attachment to community by having "a monastery of clerics" at the Cathedral who prayed the liturgy and ministered to the Faithful. His vision for community life can be found in his Rule, followed by many religious Orders, including the Norbertines (founded 1121) and the Dominicans.
